Begin with Introductory prayer recognizing the loving presence of the Trinity and ask the Holy Spirit to guide you 2. Reading: Slowly read the passage 3. Mediation: Use your imagination to enter into the Gospel story (meditation) 4. Praying: What do I say to God in response to his Word? 5.
