

What Might Have Been

Candles are lit during the reading, then extinguished during the remembrances.

Reader 1: The First Story of Creation

Reader 2: “Let there be light,”

Reader 1: and there was light.

Then God said, (Light one candle)

Reader 2: “Let there be a dome in the middle of the waters, to separate one body of water from the other.”

The water under the sky was gathered into its basin, and the dry land appeared. God called the dry land “the earth”, and the basin of the water God called “the sea”. God saw how good it was.

Then God said, (Light one candle)

Reader 2: “Let the earth bring forth vegetation:

Every kind of plant that bears seed and every kind of fruit tree on earth that bears fruit with its seed in it.”

Reader 1: And so it happened:

The earth brought forth every kind of plant that bears seed and every kind of fruit tree on earth that bears fruit with its seed in it. God saw how good it was. Evening came and morning followed ~ the third day.

Then God said, (Light one candle)

Reader 2: “Let there be lights in the dome of the sky,

To separate day from night. Let them mark the fixed times, the days and the years, and serve as luminaries in the dome of the sky, to shed light upon the earth.”

Reader 1: And so it happened.

God made the two great lights, the greater one to govern the day, and the lesser one to govern the night, and God made the stars. God set them in the dome of the sky, to shed light upon the earth, to govern the day and the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. God saw how good it was. Evening came, and morning followed ~ the fourth day.

The God said, (Light one candle)

Reader 2: “Let the water teem with an abundance of living creatures, and on the earth let birds fly beneath the dome of the sky.”

Reader 1: And so it happened:

God created the great sea monsters and all kinds of swimming creatures with which the water teems, and all kinds of winged birds. God saw how good it was, and God blessed them, saying,

(Light one candle)

Reader 2: “Be fertile, multiply and fill the water of the seas; and let the birds multiply on the earth.”

Reader 1: Evening came and morning followed ~ the fifth day.

Then God said, (Light one candle)

Reader 2: “Let the earth bring forth all kinds of living creatures: cattle, creeping things, and wild animals of all kinds.”

Reader 1: And so it happened:

God made all kinds of wild animals, all kinds of cattle, and all kinds of creeping things of the earth. God saw how good it was.

Then God said, (Light one candle)

Reader 2: “Let us make man in our image, after our likeness.

Let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, and the cattle, and all the wild animals and all the creatures that crawl on the ground.”

Reader 1: God created man in his image:

In the divine image he created him; male and female God created them.

God blessed them, saying: (Light one candle)

Reader 2: “Be fertile and multiply,

Fill the earth and subdue it. Have dominion over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, and all the living things that move on the earth.”

Reader 1: God also said, (Light one candle)

Reader 2: “See, I give you every seed-bearing plant all over the earth and every tree that has seed-bearing fruit on it to be your food; and to all the animals of the land, all the birds of the air, and all the living creatures that crawl on the ground, I give all the green plants for food.”

Reader 1: And so it happened. God look at everything he had made and he found it very good. Evening came, and morning followed ~ the sixth day.

The word of the Lord. (Light one candle)

Reader 2: Thus the heavens and the earth and all their array were completed. Since on the seventh day God was finished with the work he had been doing, he rested on the seventh day from all the work he had undertaken. So God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it he rested from all the work he had done in creation.

(Light one last candle)

(Blow out one candle)

Reader 2: We remember those who would have tilled the soil to grow food for us.
(Blow out one candle)

Reader 1: We remember those who would have been doctors and nurses caring for the sick.
(Blow out one candle)

Reader 2: We remember those who would have brightened our lives with music, dance and art. (Blow out one candle)

Reader 1: We remember those who would have been great athletes.
(Blow out one candle)

Reader 2: We remember those who would have given love and joy to others.
(Blow out one candle)
